

Since our last update, the Plant Protection Division (PPD) has continued its active surveillance and response to Yellow-Legged Hornet (YLH) activity. Between May 1 and May 14, 2025, PPD discovered 13 hornets and found and eradicated one nest. So far this year, they have set 786 traps, bringing the total to 2,032 deployed across the region. Worker hornets remain in the process of transitioning embryo nests into primary nests, a critical stage in the hornet's seasonal development.

We continue to encourage residents, especially those in the Savannah area, which includes Chatham County, southern Effingham County, and parts of Bryan County bordering Chatham, to report any suspected YLH sightings or nest activity to <u>yellow.legged.hornet@agr.georgia.gov.</u>
