- B. Egg Masses (Sept. to May)
- C. Early nymph (Apr. to July)
- D. Late nymph (July to Sept.)
- E. Adult (July to Dec.)
- F. Adult (wings open)

**IMPORTANT:** The Spotted Lanternfly is an invasive insect pest. Since 2014, it has spread to 18 states. A common means of moving this insect is by hitchhiking on vehicles. To limit the man-assisted spread of this insect, please perform a visual inspection and remove all spotted lanternfly egg masses, adults, and nymphs before leaving any infested area.

**Inspection Areas Include:** Under and inside vehicle, Bumpers and wheel wells, Behind side mirrors, Windshield wiper area, Tool Boxes / Storage Crates, Pallets / Dollies
